Discussion notes:

Proposed rebuild of Manly Boardwalk and fun pier from SeaWorld site to Manly Wharf

Purpose of new attraction is to draw more visitors to Manly and provide entertainment generally in the Manly Tourist area.

Feedback from floor included:

- Will protect beach and swimmers from boats. (Not considered a concern as swimmers and boats are well separated at this time). In fact the building of the boardwalk will cause more issues with boats and joy seekers.

Discussion from the floor:

- The cost of proposed viability study, and the projected cost of build is considered a waste of tax payers and rate payers money that should be used to rectify other local issues.
- There are enough attractions in Manly for locals and visitors to enjoy
- Harm to flora and fauna including sea grass, sea horse, fish and penguins. Manly Environment Centre is concerned about conservation of sea grass bed and sea horses, as they should be.
- Wave action storms, tide, ferries/boats will affect structure. Over time boardwalk will be subject to compounding effects of global warming and rising sea level
- Policing of boats to keep distance away from boardwalk will be difficult as we are well aware policing of rules in general is spasmodic at best.
- The construction of the boardwalk will attract more people to the site and magnify anti-social problems of alcohol, litter and noise.
- There will be a very negative impact on residents.

GMRF generally agreed the rebuild of the Manly Boardwalk will have a negative impact on the environment, the harbour beach, the residents and local business and, cause more issues for Police and Rangers. It was however agreed that GMRF will await the outcome of the study currently underway to assess the viability of the proposal by Councillor Bingham.

Follow up action required on past concerns raised with Council include the following;

- Update on steps taken by Council to address odour issues emanating from major rubbish areas (Denise, this was raised in the hotter months)
- What is Council’s plan this summer to empty bins on the beach front more frequently in peak days to ensure rubbish does not overflow and to maintain the cleanliness of the bin areas?
- What is the status of the proposed update to the Corso?
- What are the next steps on the West Esplanade Master plan?
- Is there any development on the prospect of extending Quirk Road to Kenneth Road to reduce traffic pressures?
